



Headteachers Comments:

The end of term already! Over the last few days we have been carrying out interviews for the Headteacher role at Dorothy Goodman. I am delighted to inform you that having faced fierce competition Kelly Dryden was successful in gaining the role.



There has been so much learning taking place across the school over the last few weeks and we have seen some super progress in communication and many other skills from our pupils. Yesterday I took two of our trustees and external adviser around our vocation sixth form at Middlefield Lane. One group of students were busy sorting out their sewing materials and were very proud to show and explain to us the various bags they had created using the sewing machines. Two students were clearing up in the catering servery kitchen and gave a very good account of what they had cooked for lunch and for how many – 12 meals of chicken pie and an alternative sandwich option. We then met some more students who were reviewing the menus for next term – their day for cooking is a Thursday and they were deciding what filling for the wraps. All pupils are expected in school from Monday 8th March, unless they have a shielding letter.	If you have received a shielding letter please contact school to discuss.
Secondary aged pupils to wear masks	<p>We encourage secondary aged pupils to wear face masks if they can taking into account their needs</p> <p>Please send in more than one mask so that this can be changed at suitable times during the day e.g. after eating.</p>
Lateral flow tests for students. We will be sending home more COVID-19 testing kits with your child tonight.	<p>Please make sure your child tests themselves or help them to take the test twice a week on a Monday morning (if possible and, if not Sunday night) and Thursday morning (if possible and, if not Wednesday night).</p> <p>If you think this may be difficult please contact us and we will discuss what will be best - including possible continued testing at school. Your child should continue testing twice a week, at home, throughout the Easter school holidays. This does not replace testing for those with symptoms. If you have symptoms you must self-isolate and go for a PCR test.</p>
Lateral Flow tests for staff	Lateral flow tests will be available for staff
Please remember not to send your child into school if they show any of the following symptoms	<p>a high temperature – this means the person feels hot to touch on their chest or back</p> <p>a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if they usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)</p> <p>a loss or change to sense of smell or taste – this means the person cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal</p>
