### Lateral Flow tests

Please do these on Sunday night or Monday morning; Wednesday night or Thursday morning. Follow the leaflet stages to take the test (separate leaflet **NOT** the one in the box Remember if they (or you helping them) cannot swab their throat, you can swab both nostrils instead.

What to do once you have a result:

Negative:

Pupil can still come to school (Same arrangements of protection with Hands, Face, Space) Positive: Your child MUST NOT come into school. You need to book your child for a PCR test or isolate for 10 days <u>Void</u>: Please do the test again with a new kit

### Monday 17th May

<u>Changes</u> - The following changes will be in our arrangements in line with Step 3 of the Government roadmap:

- Face coverings no longer recommended for pupils in classrooms or communal areas in all schools.
- Face coverings no longer recommended for staff in classrooms.
- Face coverings should be worn by staff and visitors in situations outside of classrooms where social distancing is not possible (for example, when moving around in corridors and communal areas).

However please be aware the reintroduction of face coverings for pupils, students or staff, may be implemented for a temporary period in response to particular localised outbreaks, including variants of concern.

We will also cautiously start to arrange bigger visits out of school.

Lemurs: We have been exploring the fruits from the story the hungry caterpillar, in Cooking we practiced chopping, we also explored the taste, smell and texture. We have done some lovely artwork, designing our own Matisse style snail pictures and using slime to make snail trails in the playground.

Leopards: We have been thinking all about beetles! In write dance we were using circle movements to draw their bodies before sticking on pictures of their faces and adding some legs. The children have all also participated well in a sensory story about "Barry the beetle" who likes dung and is very smelly! The children worked hard to wash their hands and faces during the story as well as exploring the chocolate cloud dough 'dung'.

Lions: We have been continuing our learning on Minibeasts. A real highlight being our PE lesson, we had to finish a little early because everyone had worked so hard! We had to hand out water and take a break as everyone was so hot after lots and lots of running around. Brilliant fun! Snails and slugs made up another interesting lesson. Lots of interest in making our own snails from salt dough and exploring the living slugs and snails; lots of attempts were made to turn the slugs into snails by giving them new shells to hide in! Fantastic exploration and some really gentle hands. Well done Lions class, another fun week!

<u>Llamas</u>: We have been continuing our mini beast theme. We have been focusing on how bees make honey. There was great engagement by everyone during our topic sensory story taking the bee around the flowers to gather nectar to take back to the hive. In maths we have been learning about shapes and matching and continuing shape patterns.

Jupiter: There has been some lovely work in English, the children have planned designed and built their tortoise traps from Esio Trot. There has been fantastic communication and discussion about the creations and good independence and engagement when building these. In Science the children have explored habitats and enjoyed creating oceans in a bottle, the children have continued with the Abyss sensory story working hard on their communication and anticipation. In write dance the children have been working hard copying actions and forming marks in a variety of materials. There has been some lovely intensive interaction great eye contact and initiation- well done !

<u>Mars</u>: We focused on time in Maths, using model clocks and a tuff tray where we were drawing the hands of the clock in the correct place. The children were very inventive when making shape poems in English. Some great adjectives being used for each of the 5 senses too. In PSHE we looked at self-care and had a TACPAC / Pamper session which they all thoroughly enjoyed. In ICT we began our 3 week project creating our own creature comforts story.

Mercury: The children have been developing their letter formations in Write Dance, exploring in shaving foam, crushed cereal and with ribbons. Mercury have been exploring different numbers and movements in sherborne. In Art, we painted our salt dough from Maths week. 
Soturn & Neotune: In Neotune as part of their 'mag

Saturn & Neptune: In Neptune as part of their 'maps' topic the students had to work in teams to find their way to Hollycroft Park. In English they have been watching Esio Trot and have been working on describing words. In Saturn they have enjoyed watching Creature Comforts video clips and created their own pet and a home for it to live in. In science they were learning about the Midnight Zone and did some research about the different creatures that live in the deep. Both classes in music enjoyed using the Boomwhackers - creating their own tunes and playing along to songs.

Venus: Pupils have enjoyed working on sequencing pictures to recap the story of Esio Trot and providing sentences to explain what is happening. Some pupils have enjoyed using colourful semantics to form their symbolised sentences before reading them. In Maths pupils continued to learn about mass and finding the difference between heavier and lighter. Other pupils made predictions about how much an object would weigh and operated scales to measure in grams. In PE pupils continued to develop their hockey skills by attempting set piece shooting drills whereby they had to complete 3 passes before shooting at the opposing team's goal. In ICT some pupils looked at lego stop-motion videos and created a storyboard in preparation to film their own. Some pupils worked on their ability to communicate 'yes' 'no' 'more' and 'finished' during a sensory tray exploration session. During Art pupils loved coming up with their own animal by merging together 2 animals. They used cutting and sticking skills to plan out which key features to use in their drawings.

<u>Hercules:</u> The class enjoyed PE lessons and did some good athletics, focussing on jumping. The class had a good Non-Verbal Drama lesson- working on peer interaction. We enjoyed Science looking at comparing other planets to Earth.

Iris & Zeus: Our GCSE pupils continue with their assessments - well done to all of them! Some great role playing in PSHE where pupils were going on holiday and being processed at the airport. In History we learnt about the gold rush to California and the impact it made on the expansion of America. While in Geography we learnt about the many different plants in the rainforest that are used in medicines and that help with some diseases. Some learners also took part in TeenTech live sessions, which was about the future of technology. This was led by NWSLC and many schools around the area joined in as well. Although our learners thought it started a little slow, they enjoyed designing an inactive piece of technology that could make lives either better, simpler, safer, or fun. Some imaginative ideas, including 'magnetic gloves' so that your hands don't sweat when drumming, to an app that keeps you aware of crime going on around you.

Janus: Communication games, PE and recycled items to make clothes on Monday. Tuesday we enjoyed our separate pathways and looked at British culture in citizenship. On Wednesday we started with after party dinner games and streamed into english and maths, in the afternoon we did PE. 

We have also been doing symmetry in Maths and using mirrors to find symmetry with different things. Some students have also completed there assessment this week and have done so well . We have also done a lot of well being sessions and the young people enjoyed having their hair brushed, nails painted , foot spa and lots more.

Hera: In Maths we 'virtually' went to the seaside and thought about all of the different shapes we might see on the way, e.g. road signs, in the car, on the beach.
