We have had a wonderful Maths Week with lots of different activities across the school promoting maths as fun and exciting, using creative ways to teach maths. At secondary there has been a shopping street with each of the specialist



rooms set up as either a clothes shop, bakery or supermarket. At primary the theme was Fairy Tales - Snow White's tea party focusing for example on 1:1 correspondence; 2D shapes used to design their own gingerbread house; large cardboard boxes to build the shoe-maker's house; making salt dough gingerbread men and shoes hidden in the sensory circuit. The students have responded extremely well and achieved so many skills in fun practical mathematical situations! Thank you to the Maths curriculum team for putting this together and gathering all the resources needed.

What to do once you have a result:

Negative: Pupil can still come to school (Same arrangements of protection with Hands, Face, Space)

<u>Positive</u>: Your child <u>MUST NOT</u> come into school. You need to book your child for a PCR test or isolate for 10 days Void: Please do the test again with a new kit




