

Follow the leaflet stages to take the test (separate leaflet **NOT** the one in the box Remember if they (or you helping them) cannot swab their throat, you can swab both nostrils instead.

Record results on this link <u>test result for NHS</u> **and** <u>test result for school</u> (right click on links)

### What to do once you have a result:

Negative: Pupil can still come to school (Same arrangements of protection with Hands, Face, Space)

Positive: Your child MUST NOT come into school. You need to book your child for a PCR test or isolate for 10 days

Void: Please do the test again with a new kit

Jupiter: In English we have continued with the Mythical creatures sensory story, great communication and engagement with the stations. In Maths we focused on addition. All pupils have been fantastic at solving more complex sums and problems. Great perseverance! The children really enjoyed looking at sound waves in science by waving material and then seeing the sound waves using a program on the computer.



Mercury: Class have been exploring different directions in PE and transitioned to activities of their choosing independently. The children have been engaging on different activities linking to mythical creatures in English for the poem and the sensory story. In Maths, the children have enjoyed measuring to make jelly/angel delight as well as exploring directions in sherborne. Mercury are excited to make chips today in Cookery and make telephones in Science.
