This week we started off by learning about Stonehenge in Science. It was fascinating to find out that it is nearly 5000 years old. We also learned about how the stones are lined up with great precision so you can see the sunrise on Midsummer's Day which is 21st June - the day we were learning about it! You can also see the sunset on Midwinter's Day at the opposite side of the circle. No one really knows how the stones got to the South of England but it is believed that some of them came all the way from the Preseli Hills in Wales. How on earth did they manage that?!



We also did some really tricky maths work on multiples - I (Katie) was a bit mean and gave the class some really worded questions, but they worked through them fantastically well and enjoyed the use of the white board to help.

This week in DT, we have been continuing with our 'ugly monsters' project, choosing what colour material and thread we want to use and making a start on creating our little characters. Here we have Owen's creation - "ghost man".

During our Personal Development lessons, we have continued learning more about autism. It is great to see the students gaining a better understanding of how it affects them personally, and also how it can affect others. We have enjoyed learning about and celebrating our differences.







In Science, we have been learning about energy transfer and the effect of heat on liquids and gases. Pioneer students showed great focus during our experiment in the Science lab, testing out how ice cold water and hot water had an effect on the gas inside a syringe.

This week's Cooking lesson was homemade 'pop pies'. We made our own pastry and rolled it out before adding our crushed fruit, honey and cornflour mix and making them into little parcels. After cooking them in the oven, we added icing and sprinkles on top - yummy!

On Friday, everybody did an amazing job joining in with our Sports Day event. Students showed off their skills in a variety of activities that tested their strength, balance, coordination, agility and accuracy. This included obstacle courses, races, and throwing &



batting challenges. Overall, Pioneer class got an amazing 89 points. 33 of those points were earned by our top competitor, Sol. What a great effort. Well done everyone!
