Poseidon:	The communication cafe, was the highlight of the week. All pupils used their personal communication aids to help them choose what items they wanted.

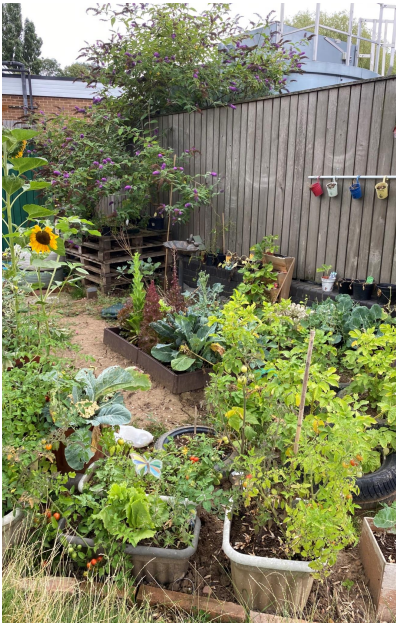
KS 4
