From our headteacher:

It was lovely to welcome so many parents and young people to the Moving On event on Monday. This was an opportunity to find out about providers who support young people as they transition to adulthood. For all those parents who will be completing an annual review for a young person leaving school this year please can I remind you that the review meeting is where you and your child will share what you would like in the future so please spend time exploring the information and thinking about this. The pupils in Zeus had a positive experience visiting the event before the end of the day and spoke with the professionals about their aspirations for the future.

Teachers Miss Holder and Mr Wilson have successfully supported the training for mentors who will support teachers entering the profession. The focus has been on making the training relevant to those staff working with pupils with SEN and they received very positive feedback on Twitter and have started to build connections with other schools.

Of course there was one young person this week who really stole the show when they joined members of Loose Women at Fosse Park. Olivia went along to learn the dance but was front and centre when the show streamed live to the studio. Olivia was so excited as Loose Women are her idols and she has been telling everyone in school about it. The episode aired on Wednesday and can be found on the ITV hub if you would like to see it

Problem solving is a key part of developing pupil understanding and this week Saturn and Neptune have been working hard to apply these skills in their maths lessons using the manipulatives (concrete objects) to help them calculate answers to questions. At the Vocational 6th Form there has been lots of independent sewing taking place with pupils using templates to ensure that their patterns are accurate. The pupils completing pathways at the secondary site have really engaged with their learning. Manay showed a focused approach to using knife skills to chop vegetables for

his gratin, which looked beautiful once it had been baked (and it smelt really good too)! In Computing PJ and Ziyaad were checking the accuracy of written work and developing their understanding of what can go wrong when using predictive text. The Animal Care Pathway were spending some time with Salt and Pepper the guinea pigs, making sure that they were cleaned out and then just enjoying time with them.


























Key Stage 1
