From our headteacher: Independence is one of the key values of the school and over the last week the pupils have been demonstrating how their independence is growing this term. Josh B (Hercules) impressed me with his explanation about his learning around internet safety. He explained that you should not share information with strangers as it could get you into trouble and he knew that when he was at home he should speak with his parents about whether or not something was safe on the computer. At the pool this week Ryan C managed to complete the whole swim session independently and Jack E shared that he was a strong swimmer after a successful session. Tigers and Turtles were really engaged in the pool whooshing around using the noodles and using the engagement to build in communication opportunities.

Emma (who led the residential) has shared some of the fantastic achievements of the pupils who went to Kingswood last week linked to taking risks and giving things a go. Alexis was very nervous about the zipwire, she stood at the top twice trying to build herself up. She watched Olivia go down and said, "If Olivia can do it, I can do it!" And she did. Naomi was very unsure of how unsteady the boats looked on the water. She refused to get on them with everyone else but when they had left down river, instantly regretted it. When they came back she was determined to get on. She had her own little trip around the river with the instructor. Amy has no fear, she stepped up to the edge of the zipwire tyre and stepped off with no hesitation at all, and she loved it! Heidi laughed her way through the whole few days, even in the her sleep! I don't think I've seen her smile so much.

In Zeus the pupils were working on creating different sounds and recording these – some of them were challenging but they used their problem solving skills and classmates to come up with some great ideas. Alfie P explained how he had used the leaves outside the classroom to create the sound of walking on snow, he recognised that Joseph had helped him and that the sound might have been even better if the leaves had been dry. In the class Nathan was exploring how a metal ruler might create the sound of clanging swords whilst Callum and Corey used the litter pickers to achieve the same effect.

#### Key Stage 1

Leopards:Leopards this week have been learning all about the celebration of Diwali, we had fun dressing up in traditional clothing, exploring lights and colours, while listening to the story of Diwali.



Lions: This week we have focused our activities around the celebration of Diwali. The pupils enjoyed exploring the theme of patterns in logic and creative. We focused on using shapes and colours to represent Rangoli patterns. We also made firework pictures related to the celebrations. There was lots of independence shown when making these pictures.



Llamas: This week we have been learning about Diwali. Everyone engaged in our massage story and enjoyed dressing up and food tasting. We have used coloured rice to make rangoli patterns and made paper plate divas.



Tigers & Turtles: We have been celebrating where the children in both classes have exploration and challenge their creativity through craft afternoons and cookery. The children have been developing their awareness of how they feel through interception. Well done Tigers and Turtles.

In Science the children have explored how we grow and develop, this week we investigated the early stages of our life and what we needed as babies and what we could do. In English we created our passports and explored what we would need to go travelling, there was interesting choices and discussion around what you need to pack.
