From our headteacher: We have enjoyed a busy week back at school. The pupils from Iris and Zeus have moved into their new base which provides them with extra space for learning, a kitchen area and accessible facilities. Although exciting it has provided a few challenges that we were not expecting so thank you to everyone for being patient whilst we work these out. Pupils from Cleveland House enjoyed accessing the pool session at the leisure centre and the Vocational 6th Form were enjoying their Circuit Training as part of their PE sessions.

I thought that it was important that I took the opportunity in this newsletter to update you about the changes to guidance linked to Covid 19 and the special school response to the Pandemic that will come into place on Monday 28th February. Please be aware that there is additional guidance in place for special schools (different to mainstream schools) and that if there were an increase in cases the UK Health Security Agency can direct us to bring in restrictions if needed.

- Staff and pupils can wear masks in school if they want to (these will no longer be compulsory). Staff will continue to wear face masks with pupils who have individual risk assessments in place.
- Staff and secondary aged pupils will continue to take part in voluntary twice weekly testing (Sunday/Monday and Wednesday/Thursday). Positive results for pupils will be recorded by contacting the school office to report your child absent (these no longer need to be recorded on the Google Form)
- Primary aged pupils can no longer be involved in testing (even if you give permission we are not allowed to test your child)
- Anybody with Covid 19 symptoms should isolate, test and remain away from school until they have had 2 negative lateral flow tests (testing can begin on day 5 of the isolation period)
- We will no longer send notifications when there have been positive cases unless this is part of an individual risk assessment for a pupil or you have asked us to provide this information

The school staff have worked hard throughout the pandemic to ensure that everyone is safe and your support with this has helped us during what have been challenging times. As we move forwards please continue to support us by keeping your child at home if they display symptoms. If they are well enough we will provide access to online learning through Google Classroom.



We are looking forward to the learning that lies ahead this term which will include visits out of school for Key Stage 1, expeditions for some of the pupils involved in the Duke of Edinburgh Awards and a residential visit for those pupils who are in their last year at school. It is going to be a busy half term!


