

from 12 noon to 7 pm for 16+ from 3:15pm to 7pm for 5+

No appointment necessary Pfizer only - 1st, 2nd, 3rd and booster jabs if due

Please have your NHS number handy if possible

- Children aged 5+ attending will be offered a single dose of the Pfizer vaccine and must be accompanied by parents or guardians so consent can be obtained.
- Children aged 5+ will have to wait 12 weeks after testing positive for Covid before they can have the vaccine. Adults need to wait 28 days after testing positive.
- 12 weeks between doses for 5 to 17 year olds and 8 weeks for adults.

Humanities is all about emigration and Ellis Island at the moment and we continued with our story and our Sherbourne.


