

Please have your NHS number handy if possible

- Children aged 5+ attending will be offered a single dose of the Pfizer vaccine and must be accompanied by parents or guardians so consent can be obtained.
- Children aged 5+ will have to wait 12 weeks after testing positive for Covid before they can have the vaccine. Adults need to wait 28 days after testing positive.
- 12 weeks between doses for 5 to 17 year olds and 8 weeks for adults.

## PE, School Sport and Physical Activity



Highlight of the week: This week a group of our secondary students represented the school at the Regional Athletics Championships in Leicester. We competed in both track and field events, with a variety of different experience levels in the team. The students did a fantastic job of showcasing what we work so hard on in school, especially through some outstanding displays of resilience in the 800m race in particular from Emma, Callum and Ryan. At the end of the day the results were still coming in, but we ended up with medals in Shot Put, 100m, 200m, 800m and 110m Wheelchair Slalom. The standout performers were Will (Gold in Shot), Emma (Silver in 100m, 200m) and Lillibeth (Bronze in 100m, 200m) although all of our athletes should be extremely proud of their efforts and can now call themselves Regional Athletes!

- This week we carried on our work on 'agility' with a variety of games and activities focussed on being quicker. We have also spoken a lot about how we manage winning/losing in activities too and the students have shown great sportsmanship in encouraging each other too.
- This week our focus was on throwing events in Athletics, using different pieces of equipment and different techniques. Students engaged really well in their new skills. Meanwhile the hydropool group worked on important mobility and play skills in the pool, through movement.
- We continue our work in athletics, this week with a focus on jumping for distance and height.

  Students embraced the healthy competition in the lesson and engaged really well with each other. The MATP group showcased their skills to the new teacher in KS4 and worked on their personalised targets.
- This week our D of E running group had to embrace change and work on their fitness and muscular endurance in a new way. Whilst there were some sore thighs afterwards (that's not just Mr Roadley), they all gave 100% to the session.


