



- Children aged 5+ will have to wait 12 weeks after testing positive for Covid before they can have the vaccine. Adults need to wait 28 days after testing positive.
- 12 weeks between doses for 5 to 17 year olds and 8 weeks for adults.


PE, School Sport and Physical Activity



Last Friday, we took 2 teams to play football at Maplewell Hall School. Our girls' team played first in a really competitive fixture. During the first half, we were the better side with Emma acting as a fantastic leader on the pitch and organising the team. Chloe kept things solid at the back, Missy and Ellie did a great job winning the ball for us, and Erin made some fantastic saves for us to keep us in the game. We managed to get everyone involved in the play and scored some good goals. Lillibeth and Alexie were the pick of our goalscorers, but the best of our goals was a strike from her half by Emma. In the second half, their extra number and substitute began to pay dividend for the opposition and they came back at us strong, but despite our tired legs the girls fought to the end. We eventually came out with a 7-6 defeat but they can all be really proud of the performance in our first all-girls football fixture. Our Boys' team were next to be involved and due to the high interest from Maplewell students, they had 3 teams for us to compete against in a mini Round Robin tournament of shorter games than the girls had played. The boys managed to win their first game 3-1, lost their second 4-0 and drew 2-2 in the final game. They played against some really strong and experienced teams, who have been playing against other schools for some time. Standout performers were Tarell and Joseph for carrying the ball superbly throughout, Will for his goalkeeping skills and Harley C for a few smart finishes. Harley M, Ethan, Ryan and Callum also did an excellent job for us, breaking up the play and keeping the ball moving. Other highlights for us were the way that the students managed going to another school and mixed with the other students, to create a really positive and friendly atmosphere whilst not playing. It was great to see so many different social opportunities taken and the chance to meet other students fully embraced. Thank you must go out to Mr Gray, from Maplewell, for host and as ever to Trade Centre UK for providing our Girls' team kit.

As we close out the term, the classes have been working hard on applying the skills that we have been working on throughout the year. This will then begin to transition to preparing the students for events that are coming up next half-term, including the national disability athletics championships, primary parallel championships, 10-pin bowling events for both primary and secondary, Step into Sport Leadership event and of course sports day.

Athena: Athena class have had a great week? We learned all about Richard III in Humanities at the start of the week and we've made lots of things ready for our Jubilee picnic on Friday!


