In Cooking, we planned a Seasonal Menu to round off our unit on Seasonal Foods and we enjoyed making Stained Glass biscuits.




POLAR

We are working really hard to get things organised for Fusion Fest and can't wait to see everybody there next week!






ODYSSEY


