
RANGER - Karen

We are definitely on the way to planning our Festive Fusion bits in Aquarius and one student helped us get into the spirit of Christmas with their wonderful artwork!


We've worked together to search up genres and blurbs of books for one of our stalls we'll be doing, so keep your eyes peeled if you visit on the 21st 🔎 😊


