






#### CALIPSO - Sam S


### MARINER - Simon

Simon and Max's efforts.






# **AQUARIUS - Kotie**




In Maths with upper school this week, we have focused on exterior and interior angles of (regular) polygons.

We did a 'hands-on' task which involved extending lines of the polygons that students drew to see where the external angles are, then cut all the pieces out.

Students could then see that no matter what size polygon they had, they all created angles around a point, pretty much proving that all polygons have exterior angles summing to 360°.





Students then used this to calculate any missing angles in further images provided to them to practise knowing this new rule.

Lewis later used the little whiteboard to showcase interior angles by splitting regular polygons into minimal triangles, finally working out the rule (n-2)x180°.

Another student has worked on using lots of angle rules to "prove geometric facts" which was impressive to watch!



#### NEW HORIZONS - Jenni



In PE, students have been refining their skills in Archery, focusing on





The size charts will be added before we go live to make it much easier to size up.




