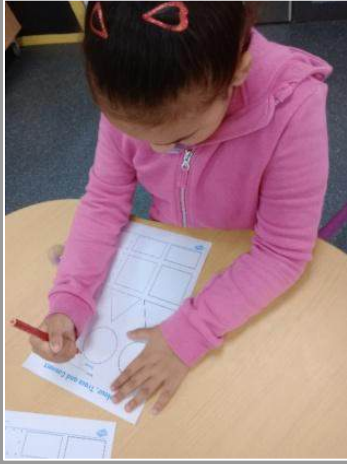

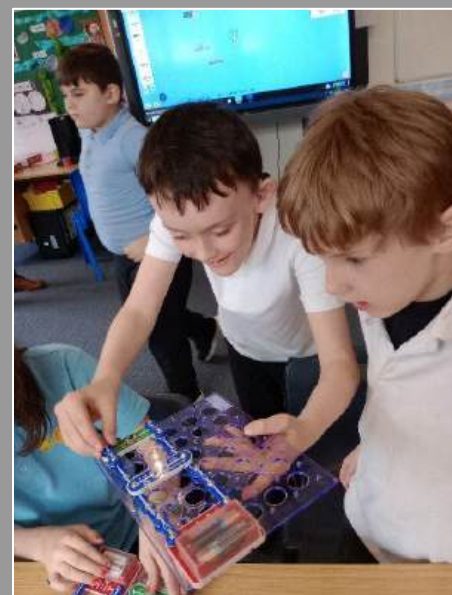

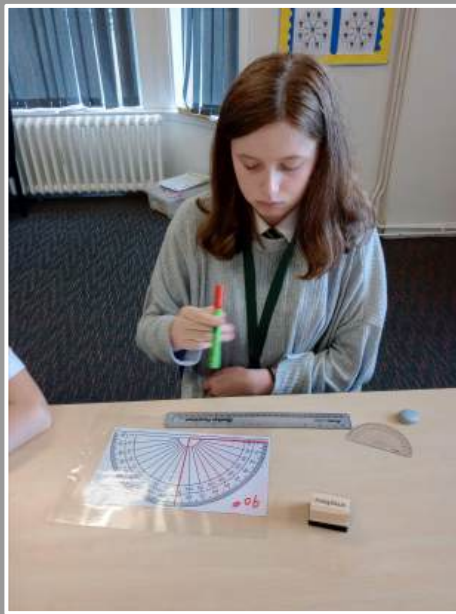

- Growing numbers of new micro traders sell a wide range of products online or through 'pop-up' stores.
- Rental of goods is increasing, in areas like fashion, furniture and white goods.
- There's a shift towards sustainability and the repair and refurbishment of products is growing.
- Some consumers are also highly interested in the ethics and ethos of brands.
- The High Street will continue to be creative and innovative to address ongoing changes in consumer behaviour.
