Richmond pupils have been busy bees this week, both in and out of the classroom. They've been actively involved in organising and preparing the school allotment, learning about various community jobs and stewardship. It's wonderful to see them taking ownership of their environment and contributing to the wider school community. The pupils have been engaging with The Lion King, creating masks and props linked to the story to help them re-create different characters through movement and actions.

At Ravenhurst, Mark had the privilege of supporting a group of pupils at the hydro pool this week. It was great to witness the pupils increased confidence in the water. The school also experienced their first fire drill this week! All off the pupils managed the situation really positively. The classes have also been immersing themselves in sensory learning activities slinked to their texts, from building jacks beanstalk to moving like animals using props.

Over at The Hinckley School and Cleveland House, pupils have been engaging with work experience opportunities and supporting our younger pupils at the Primary Site. The experience has been incredibly beneficial for everyone involved, fostering a sense of community and responsibility. There has also been some really focussed learning and positive feedback for pupils accessing main school inclusion lessons. Some of the Cleveland House pupils have also been working on planning a potential trip to demonstrate the skills they have been working on in Social Communication lessons.

AUDITOR JOB PROFILE

Internal and external auditors check organisations' financial records and procedures to make sure they are accurate and efficient.

Average Salary: £19,000 per year starter to £65,000 per year experienced

Typical hours (per week): 37 to 39 – you could work evenings and/or away from home

Skills & Knowledge: knowledge of economics and accounting, math's knowledge, to be thorough and pay attention to detail, analytical thinking skills, the ability to accept criticism and work well under pressure, business management skills, customer service skills, excellent written

communication skills, to be able to use a computer and the main software packages confidently

Restrictions & Requirements: To be an external auditor, you'll need to be a qualified chartered accountant and a member of one of the following professional bodies:

Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA)

Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW)

The Association of International Accountants (AIA)

Institute of Chartered Accountants of Scotland (ICAS)

You'll need to be a member of the The Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy to carry out audits in the public sector.

If you're qualified as an accountant with the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA), you can carry out internal audits.

Activities: examine company accounts, identify any risks to the business, assess the company's financial reporting systems, interview staff to gather evidence, observe business processes, analyze financial data, make recommendations for improvements

Working Environment: in an office or at a client's business

How To Become: a University course – do a degree then join a graduate scheme to complete further training – employers accept a range of degree subjects eg accountancy, economics, business & finance, IT & Computing; an apprenticeship – do a higher apprenticeship as an internal audit practitioner or a level 7 apprenticeship as an internal audit professional; apply directly and join as a trainee auditor – you will usually need at least A level qualifications or equivalent and will be expected to take further training as your career develops; train with a professional body eg the National Audit Office offers apprenticeships or graduate schemes

Career Path & Progression: As an experienced external auditor, you could move into management and then become a partner or finance director. You could also set up your own accountancy practice. As an experienced internal auditor, you could move into a management role. You could also become a chartered internal auditor, or become a self-employed consultant.
